
Aim: To visit the rural settlement & study the socio-economic & cultural aspects of rural life as a part of curriculum.




Day 2nd: Sunday, 10th April, 2022

Aim


To create awareness among students about a medical condition named as 'Endometriosis' affecting many women worldwide.


Various indoor games like carom, Chess were arranged and each team need to send their players for competition. Winning competition benefitted team with earning winning points.


Day 1- Departure and Ellora Caves

We reached the AGC around 8:30 pm. The dinner was served by 9:00pm after which all of us, being tired, decided to call it a night and retired to our allotted rooms:






Day 2- Ajanta Cayes



Day 5- Bibi Ka Magbara and Return






Nek Chand, a former Road Inspector in Chandigarh. In the evening all the participants had visited to Sukhna Lake of Chandigarh.

Capitol complex Chandigarh

The Capitol Complex is strategically located at the geographic and topographic 'head' of the city against the backdrop of the Shivalik Hills. Corbusier deliberately attempted to visually and physically detach the Complex from the city, providing a calm site for the efficient functioning of the three pillars of democracy," explains director of Le Corbusier Centre and Chandigarh Architecture Museum.

The three buildings in the Capitol Complex – the secretariat, the assembly and the high court – face each other. The high court was the first building to be completed (March, 1955), followed by the secretariat (March 1958) and the assembly (March 1961).

The high court and the assembly are connected by a 400m elevated piazza and the unique design of the secretariat building gives one the impression of layers of concrete slabs. The 240m long and 50m high structure was the tallest structure in Punjab when it was built.




Golden temple, Amritsar

Participants visited to Golden Temple of Amritsar. The Golden Temple, also known as Harmandir Sahib, is a Gurdwara, located in the city of Amritsar. It is the holiest Gurdwara and the most important pilgrimage site of Sikhism. The temple is built around a man-made pool (Sarovar) that was completed by Guru Ram Das in 1577. The Harmandir Sahib is an open house of worship for all men and women, from all walks of life and faith. It has a square plan with four entrances, has a circumambulation path around the pool. The temple is a




collection of buildings around the sanctum and the pool. The Golden Temple's architecture reflects different architectural practices prevalent in the Indian subcontinent, as various iterations of temple were rebuilt and restored. The Temple is described by Ian Kerr, and other scholars, as a mixture of the Indo-Islamic Mughal and the Hindu Rajput architecture.




Virasat-e-Khalsa


The visit to Gol Ghumaz was followed by lunch after which we left for Ibrahim Roza.

The day ended with a decision with the faculty and tour organizers about all that we had seen and learnt in tour till now. Then we proceed to resort.





T.Y. B.Arch. | Settlement Study | 25 Nov – 2 Dec 2017



Introduction:

This settlement study was a part of our academic curriculum with a purpose of increase in our knowledge about a settlement with reference to impact of social organizations, their daily lifestyle, flora and fauna, infrastructure development etc.

We left for Baramati on the same night and reached to Baramati on 2nd December Sunday.





Figure 3 Houses of Goa
